If you have a cell phone, **be sure to enter a number for ICE:** ICE stands for “In Case of Emergency”. You can enter several numbers: .. ICE 1, ICE 2, etc. Emergency personnel know to look for that on cell phones.

Lafayette Co in Mississippi is starting a **Yellow Dot program**. A yellow dot sticker can go on the rear window of your car. This yellow dot indicates that there is a packet of information in the glove compartment of the car. That information includes contact information, medical history and a list of current medicines. Please note any other contact info or concerns you might have such as invalid neighbor or relatives, pets, et cetera.

This information will be used only to reach you or your relatives in the case of an emergency when the members of your congregation are concerned for your safety and wellbeing, such as in the aftermath of a hurricane, tornado, or other disaster. This information will not be published anywhere else or shared with anyone except members of UUCO) who are trying to find you or offer assistance to you.
