**>>AFTER THANKSGIVING POTLUCK <<**

**After Thanksgiving Potluck**

Nan Johnson and Stewart Gurnsey wish to invite all UU's and friends to a potluck.

**Where:** Dancing Goat Farm (see directions, below)

**When:** Sunday, November 28<sup>th</sup>, following our regular service.

**Directions:** Take Highway 7 South out of Oxford all the way to Water Valley area (be sure to bear RIGHT at the Hgwy 7 and Hgwy 9W split).

As you approach Water Valley, the highway goes from two to 4 lanes and you will see the letters for Water Valley in the hillside to your left. Get in the RIGHT lane and turn right on Hwy 315N (Batesville). You will see the Shell gas station sign on your right as you approach this intersection, plus a flashing light. O'Tuck Farm Supply will be on your left just after you turn onto 315.

Go on 315N to the first intersection ( about a mile or so ) and turn RIGHT unto Campground Road. As you are approaching this intersection will see the airport sign (on the right, telling you to turn left) and a sign for Campground Baptist Church. You may also notice on your far left the 7th Day Adventist Church (but it is tucked in the woods and a little hard to spot).

Once on Campground Road continue for about 2/10th of a mile - it ends in a T (really more of a Y) with the church (brick and white) on your left. Turn left around the church (sort of a blind curve so go cautiously) and you will be on Yalobusha CR 110. This continues for a few hundred yards and then turns into Lafayette CR 390. You will notice a double yellow line suddenly appearing in the middle of the road when you enter Lafayette Co.!

NOTE: (Please do not take the little road that forks off to the right just past the church, that is CR 111.....be sure to stay on CR 110).

Our address is 56 and 58 CR 390. Our driveway is on the RIGHT (in a curve in the road that bears left). There is a gray post with the two numbers, plus a small red and white sign, Dancing Goats Farm, in the pine tree at base of driveway. Also a black mailbox and an Oxford Eagle mailbox by the post. A small wood house painted green with a little porch is on your left as you go up our driveway. Continue past the house on the main driveway and after a turn you will see our house in the middle of

the pasture. Follow the arrows for parking!

I will hang yellow and red plastic pennants on the tree and post to mark our driveway. From the church where you are turning left onto CR 110 to our driveway it is about 7/10th of a mile, no more. If you get lost , call **473-3670!**

Please wear comfortable clothes and sturdy walking shoes if you plan to visit with the animals and/or go goatwalking in the woods!
